 - Interprofessional training/team approach (including family caregivers)

Healthier Together

- Community driven, multi-year, place-based funding approach
- Solve complex health issues, neighborhood by neighborhood.
- Focus on 6 communities
 - The Glades
 - Jupiter (especially around El Sol)
 - Delray Beach
 - Riviera Beach/NW West Palm Beach
 - Lake Worth
 - Boynton Beach
- Maximize impact by allocating \$1 million each to neighborhood over the next five to seven years for collaborative health-related projects within the foundation's priority areas: diabetes prevention and management, family caregiving and behavioral health
